

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.068264 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Galveston County Emergency Services District #2.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.068264 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.062859 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.068264 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2022 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Galveston County Emergency Services District #2 from the same properties in both the 2021 tax year and the 2022 tax year. The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Galveston County Emergency Services District #2 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate. The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Galveston County Emergency Services District #2 is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2022 tax year.

A public hearing on the proposed tax rate will be held September 21, 2022 at 3:00 pm at 930 Noble Carl Road, Crystal Beach, Texas 77650.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Galveston County Emergency Services District #2 is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Board of Directors of Galveston County Emergency Services District #2 at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by Galveston County Emergency Services District #2 last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by Galveston County Emergency Services District #2 this year.
