

Rip currents are strong channels of water moving quickly away from shore.




Myth: A strong swimmer can out swim a rip current.

CHEMICALS

Chemicals are used to make many important things we use everyday. Know how to stay safe around chemicals at home.



Never play with chemicals



Use cleaners with an adult



Keep chemicals away from babies



Do not play with dish or laundry pods







If there is a chemical emergency, you may be told to "shelter in place." This will help you stay safe while responders work.

- 1. Go Inside Get everyone indoors and turn off the air conditioner.
- 2. Stay Connected Listen to official news updates for more information.
- 3. Follow Directions When emergency alerts are given, do what you are told.


