The RFP states the following bond requirements on page 3: Bid Bond of 5% of contract value, Performance **Question #12:** Bond of 100% of contract value, and Payment Bond of 100% of contract value. This requirement was repeated in several sections i.e. page 97, G and H. However, on page 115, point A, the requirements are stated for the proposal of a 5% Bid Bond and a 100% Performance Bond. Would the county please clarify the bond requirements for this RFP? The requirements for bonding shall be as described in the General Provisions, Page 19 (page 22 is searching the pdf Response: document), item 39, Proposal Guarantee, and item 40, Performance and Payment Bonds. Would the county clarify if an annual renewal bond form would be acceptable for this 3-year contract? Ouestion #13: Yes. Response: The RFP was advertised on March 28 and unable to be downloaded on the website until April 4. It was clarified Question #14: during the mandatory meeting on April 10 that the due date is April 29 by 2:00pm cst. With respect to this crucial time to review the RFP, plan and prepare a high-quality proposal, would the county please consider an extension of May 6 at 2:00pm cst? The solicitation deadline / proposal opening date has been amended. Response: 2 CFR 200.321 for Minority Women Business Enterprises is referred to several times in the RFP. Question #15: a. Is there a list of MWBE partners that Galveston County is in current partnership with? 1. If so, may we have access to this list? b. What is the expected percentage of participation required for MWBE partnerships? a. There is no list of MWBE partners. b. The County does not have a percentage requirement, however, look Response: favorably on the contractor's compliance with the mandates mentioned in 2 CFR 200. Can you please provide sales by day and meal period for all staff meals for the months of February and March Ouestion #16: Please see attached. Response: Can you clarify the recording and payments for all staff meals please? Question #17: Recording is done by sign-in sheet and billed monthly. Response:

Question #18: How is the billing for a staff meal calculated?

Response: The Food Services manager utilizes the sign-in sheets and price per meal to give a monthly total.

Question #19: Is there a Point-of-Sale system in place and if so, what system is being used?
