WELCOME TO THE PARK SIDE

This section will highlight one of our parks by giving a little history, the kind of amenities the park has, and the staff that work there.

CARBIDE PARK - Donated to Galveston County from Union Carbide in 1969, this 70 acre park, is known as the main headquarters for the Parks & Cultural Services Department.

Various amenities are sprinkled throughout the park and include basketball courts, tennis & pickleball courts, playgrounds, pavilions, and walking trails.

The Wayne Johnson Community Center is located here and houses our senior citizens program and is also available for rentals. The Pioneer House serves as the meeting place for our quilters and can also be rented out. The County Extension has their office building here too and is home to the Master Gardeners and the Discovery garden. As one of our most popular parks, you'll find people playing, jogging, walking their dogs or just relaxing under the pavilions. Most weekends the pavilions are reserved for a variety of events.

If you find yourself here, look out for the Carbide parks maintenance crew - Broderick, Kevin, and Andre. These 3 do all the maintenance, trash pickup, and outdoor restroom cleanings for this park and they also pull trash at Jones Bay Boat Ramp. STAY BEACHY!

This section will talk about all things Bolivar Beach Parking Sticker Program. The program started in 2007 and has been thriving ever since. Led by Michael Lentz, our Bolivar Beach Sticker Supervisor, the program sells parking stickers that allow people to park on the Bolivar Beaches for \$10. This is an annual parking sticker and the color changes every calendar year. The program has consistently generated over \$800,000 in revenue the last 5 years. The unique thing about this program is that it's 100% self-sustaining. The revenue generated can only be spent on the improvements and safety of the Bolivar Beaches. The program is regulated by the Texas General Land Office (GLO) and they determine what is an eligible expense to spend the revenue on. The parking sticker funds can pay for regular annual expenses like the salaries and benefits of the staff that work the program, the parking stickers, litter pickup, beach patrols by the Sheriff's Office, trash barrel services, port-o-let services, signage, cleaning services for restrooms, repairs to equipment and general beach maintenance.

It can also pay for projects like the Bolivar Beach Pavilion, amenities on the beach, dune restoration and walkovers for public areas, beach tractors, and UTVs. The funds can't be spent on anything off the Bolivar Peninsula or any areas or amenity that doesn't have direct beach access. * FY2025 BUDGET *

DID YOU KNOW?

- Galveston County has over 14 parks and 9 boat ramps that are maintained by 20 parks maintenance workers and 6 park facility maintenance workers. Together they cover over 1,000 acres of Parkland!
- The Galveston County Senior Citizens program offers transportation to our seniors to & from the center, for grocery shopping, to go to the bank, and pharmacy.
