A surprise cash count of the Tax Office's Galveston, Santa Fe, Texas City, Crystal Beach, League City and Friendswood branch locations was conducted from January 8, 2019 through January 17, 2019. The objectives of the cash count were to (a) determine if all collections had been accounted for at the time of the cash count, and (b) determine if the collections were properly handled and deposited in a timely manner.

Collections Accounted For

At the time of the surprise cash count, all collections were accounted for at all branch locations, including \$17,000.00 in change funds.

Collections Handled Properly

It is a very important control for collections to be properly handled and deposited in a timely manner. For collections to be handled properly, they must be safeguarded against loss; therefore, all negotiable instruments must be kept secured at all times and deposited on a daily basis.

Collections are handled properly and all negotiable instruments were secured and deposited on a daily basis.

Deposited in a Timely Manner

Collections are being deposited in a timely manner (daily), minimizing exposure to loss.

At the time of the surprise cash count, all collections were accounted for at the Galveston, Santa Fe, Texas City, Crystal Beach, League City and Friendswood branch locations. Cash drawers not in use were locked and stored in a locked safe at all times.
