Certain architectural record drawings are available. These were used in the preparation of this request for proposal. See Architectural Sheet A-102 for information on the parapet and trims. The approximate dimensions of the windows effected are per a Damage Descriptions and Dimensions document prepared by FEMA. An excerpt regarding the windows is provided as follows:

Room 4300 IT Training:

- Building Interior, 1 each of aluminium framed fixed double-paned tempered glass
- 3.16 Ft high, water collecting between panes, possible wind blown debris, 0% work completed.

Wall of windows:

Building Exterior, rubber seal around (9) 3.1 FT long x 2 .70 FT wide aluminium framed windows, 311.31 LF long, wind vibration resulted in seal separation, 0% work completed. Building Exterior, rubber seals around (69) 5.83 FT long x 3.16 FT wide aluminium framed windows, 1.240.62 LF long, wind vibration resulted in seal separation, 0% work completed. Building Exterior rubber seals around (32) 2 FT long x 3.16 FT wide aluminium framed windows, 330.24 LF long, wind vibration resulted in seal separation, 0% work completed.

Question #18: Will the county perform a punch prior to allowing the employees and office equipment to

return?

Answer: No employees or equipment to be replaced or removed.

Question #19: Will the contractor be allowed to use bathroom facilities or will be required to supply

portable units

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of ""identifiers"" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

- 1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:
- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the

Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:


3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:




THE GALVESTON COUNTY JUSTICE CENTER COURTS BUILDING SUSTAINED DAMAGES DUE TO HURRICANE HARVEY STRIKING THE TEXAS GULF COAST FROM ROCKPORT TO GALVESTON ONTO PORT ARTHUR IN 2017. DAMAGE WAS CAUSED BY CONSISTANT WIND DRIVEN RAINS OVER A THREE DAY PERIOD. THE RAIN INFILTRATED THE FACILITY THROUGH DAMAGED NEOPRENE GASKET SEALS ON WINDOWS AND UNDER DOOR THRESHOLDS.

IN ADDITION, THE WINDS CAUSED POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE FORCES AGAINT THE EXTERIOR FINISH INSULATION SYSTEMS (E.I.F.S.) AND SUPPORTING LIGHT WEIGHT METAL FRAMING ON THE ARTICULATED CORNICE AND MID-LEVEL ACCENT BANDS OF THE SAME MATERIALS. THE ENSURING WINDS CAUSED THESE FLEVIBLE MATERIALS TO CRACK AND IN PLACES FALL 2 AND 4 STOREYS TO THE GROUND.

THE E.I.F.S. AT ALL LOCATIONS WILL BE REMOVED AS WELL AS BACK-UP SHEATHING AND THE LIGHT METAL FRAMING FROM EXISTING STRUCTURAL STEEL SUPORTING MEMBERS THAT WERE NOT DAMAGED IN THE HURRICANE. REPLACEMENT MATERIALS WILL BE COLD-ROLLED HEAVY GAUGE METAL FRAMING WITH GLASS FIBER REINFORCED CONCRETE (GFRC) PANELS OF LIKE SIZE, PROFILES AND SHAPES ATTACHED TO THE HEAVY GAUGE METAL FRAMING.

INTERIOR DAMAGES CAUSED BY THE WIND DRIVEN RAIN WILL CONSIST OF ISOLATED AREAS OF SHEET VINYL FLOORING, VINYL COMPOSITION TILES AND REPLACING SELECTED BROCKEN INSULATED GLAZINGS AND SEALS IN THE EXISTING ALUMINUM FRAMING, THAT WILL REMAIN. ALL REPLACEMENT MATERIALS WILL MATCH EXISTING IN KIND, COLOR AND SHAPE.

LASTLY SEALED JOINTS AND BACKER ROD MATERIALS WILL BE REMOVED AROUND THE ENTIRE BUILDING. JOINTS WILL BE THOROUGHLY CLEANED AND NEW NON-CELL BACKER ROD WITH NON-SHRINKING SILICONE WILL BE APPLIED OVER IT


